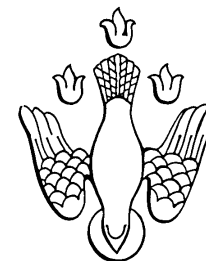
Patronal Festival Celebrations Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 May
