WELCOME

ASCENSION DAY

The Ascension of Jesus is the departure of the risen Jesus from the earth. The narrative in the first Chapter of the Acts of the Apostles takes place 40 days after Easter Day. Jesus is taken up in the sight of the disciples after telling them to remain in Jerusalem until the coming of the Holy Spirit; as he ascends a cloud hides him from their view and they saw two men in white who told them that Jesus will return 'in the same way you have seen him go into heaven' In the Christian tradition, the Ascension is connected with the exaltation of Jesus, meaning that because of his Ascension Jesus continues alive, at the right hand of God and he lives to pray for his people. The risen Jesus departs, and his people await the coming of God the Holy Spirit.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, for forty days we have been celebrating with joyful hearts the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, his bursting from the tomb and his defeat of the power of sin and death. He appeared to his disciples many times and told them about the kingdom of God.

Today we recall how he left this earth and returned to his Father, ascending into heaven to take his throne over all dominions and powers. Trusting in his reign over all creation, and submitting to his kingly yet loving rule, let us hear the story of his parting.

Sit THE ASCENSION READING Acts 1.4-11 read by Roger Heath Bullock

While staying with the apostles, Jesus ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This', he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.' So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'

When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards

heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

NEW TESTAMENT Daniel 7.9-14 read by Berrie Norton

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne: his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousand served him. and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. GOSPEL READING Luke 24.44-53

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.



Jesus said to the disciples, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you - that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses

of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.'

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

All strength is in your hand, all power to you is given; all wisdom to command in earth and hell and heaven: beyond all words creation sings the King of kings and Lord of lords.


