
FIRST READING Isaiah 40.12-17, 27-end read by Bob Ellison

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the Lord, or as his counsellor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness.

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall

exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Artists-in-Residence Display – South Garth

During *The People's Cathedral* project we have had two artists-in-residence and from the beginning of June Richard Ellis' photographs have been enjoyed by many. This week our second artist *Cabinet of Curiosities* (Edmund Salter and Caroline Collinge) presented their work which is now displayed in the South Garth. They work entirely in paper and so the beautiful pieces are fragile. Please do go into the south garth and see this exquisite work. Children need to be accompanied. The display will remain until the end of August.

The Feast of Corpus Christi – 15 June

The Day of Thanksgiving for the Institution of Holy Communion, in shorthand Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ), is celebrated in the Church of England calendar on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, this year Thursday 15th June. Here at the cathedral it will be marked with a celebration of the Eucharist sung by the cathedral choir at 7.00pm that day. The intention of the day is both to give thanks for the gift of Holy Communion, instituted by Jesus on Maundy Thursday, and to reflect and focus on the presence of Jesus Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist. The readings for the day reflect this (Genesis 14.18-20; I Corinthians 11.23-26 & John 6.51-58). It also affords an opportunity to reflect on the way in which Christ is present with and in his Body, the Church, and the blessing Christ offers to the world.

Walsingham Pilgrimage – 16 to 18 June

Canon Andrew will be leading a group of pilgrims from the cathedral and university to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham and the pilgrims will set off from the cathedral after being blessed in the Lady Chapel at 0930 on Friday. The pilgrims will be praying for the Cathedral and its communities, and please pray for the pilgrims too.

Offertory Procession - Extending Participation

Each week at the Cathedral Eucharist, immediately after the Peace and during the offertory hymn, two people bring forward bread and wine (this is before the collection begins). Known as the Offertory Procession, the bread and wine are brought from the midst of the congregation and received by the deacon and server and taken to the altar. This is the bread and wine that is to be used for the Eucharist. The reason for the bringing up of these gifts is to signify that the Eucharist is an offering of the whole people of God in worship and praise. It precedes and complements the offering of our money in the collection. We want to extend the number of people who participate in doing this so that it reflects the breadth and diversity of our community. The great thing is, for those who like to avoid too public roles, is that whilst this is a visible role, it is not one in which public speaking is needed. It is open to everyone, and we would like to encourage everyone to participate. We do need to know if you would be interested. We organise this on a rolling basis based on peoples' availability.
