

THE SEASON OF LENT

The season of Lent enables us to prepare for Easter, the most important festival of the church year. Easter is the principal occasion for baptism and for the reconciliation of those who had been excluded from the Church's fellowship for apostasy or serious faults. This connection explains the characteristic notes of Lent – self-examination, penitence, self-denial and study, to which almsgiving has traditionally been added.

The first lesson is written in the first chapter of the book of Joshua, beginning at the first verse.

After the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, the Lord spoke to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' assistant, saying, 'My servant Moses is dead. Now proceed to cross the Jordan, you and all this people, into the land that I am giving to them, to the Israelites. Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given to you, as I promised to Moses. From the wilderness and the Lebanon as far as the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, to the Great Sea in the west shall be your territory. No one shall be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will not fail you or forsake you. The second lesson is written in the sixth chapter of the letter to the Ephesians, beginning at the tenth verse.

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and

flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

BISHOP ANDREW WATSON

On Tuesday 3 March, The Bishop of Dorking, The Right Reverend Paul Davies, wrote a letter to all in Guildford Diocese, saying:

‘It is with very deep sadness that I write to inform you of the death of our beloved Bishop Andrew. Following his diagnosis of inoperable pancreatic cancer last month, he entered into his eternal rest this morning, Tuesday 3 March, at his home, Willow Grange, in the presence of his much-loved family. Words are inadequate to articulate the sense of loss marked by Bishop Andrew’s death. I have expressed our deepest sympathy, together with the assurance of our love and prayers, to Beverly, Hannah, Sam, Joe, Lydia and the whole family. And whilst they mourn the loss of a much-loved husband, father, grandfather, son and brother, we mourn the loss of a much-loved diocesan bishop – as well as an inspiring fellow disciple, dear brother in Christ, precious friend and special colleague.’

Dean Bob wrote, ‘We give thanks to God for Bishop Andrew’s life and ministry, for the laughter he brought, for the faith he kindled, and for the countless ways in which he served others before himself. We grieve his passing as those who mourn - but not as those without hope. In the words of the apostle he so loved to preach, we believe that neither death, nor life, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.’

Please pray for Bishop Andrew’s family and colleagues. Details about Bishop Andrew’s funeral will be circulated when known.

GUILDFORD CATHEDRAL PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM AUGUST 2026

We will once again be going on pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham in 2026. The pilgrimage will run from Friday 28 – Sunday 30 August, with the option of staying until after breakfast on Monday 31 August. We are very pleased that Dean Bob will be accompanying us. The pilgrimage provides opportunities to take part in the rich liturgies of the Shrine, Sunday Eucharist at St Mary's Parish Church, a visit to the Slipper Chapel and Roman Catholic shrine, or quiet reflection in the grounds of the Shrine and walking in the lovely Norfolk countryside near the Shrine. Fellowship and deepening of faith is at the heart of the pilgrimage. The cost, full board including breakfast, lunch and dinner in the Shrine refectory will be approximately £290 or £200 per person, depending on whether you depart on the Monday or Sunday.
