

THE SEASON OF LENT

The season of Lent enables us to prepare for Easter, the most important festival of the church year. Easter is the principal occasion for baptism and for the reconciliation of those who had been excluded from the Church's fellowship for apostasy or serious faults. This connection explains the characteristic notes of Lent – self-examination, penitence, self-denial and study, to which almsgiving has traditionally been added.

RECEIVING BISHOP ANDREW

At the beginning of this service, we will receive Bishop Andrew's coffin into the Cathedral to rest here overnight before his funeral tomorrow at 12 noon.

As the coffin arrives at the door, the bishop says*

May the God of hope give you fullness of peace
and may the Lord of life be always with you.

And also with you.

The coffin is sprinkled with holy water

In the water of baptism Andrew died with Christ
and rose with him in new life.
May he now share with him eternal glory.

The Diocesan crozier is placed on the coffin

In life Andrew cherished the Gospel of Christ.
May Christ now greet him with these words of eternal life:
Come, blessed of my Father!

In baptism Andrew received the sign of the cross.
May he now share in Christ's victory over sin and death.

*The coffin is signed with the cross.
A mitre and a chalice are placed on the coffin.*

My brothers and sisters,
we believe that all the ties of friendship and affection
which knit us as one throughout our lives do not unravel with death.

Confident that God always remembers the good we have done
and forgives our sins,
let us pray, asking God to gather Andrew to himself:

Lord, in our grief we turn to you.

whom you have called out of this world:

NEW TESTAMENT Matthew 20.17-end

The second lesson is written in the twentieth chapter of the gospel of Matthew beginning at the seventeenth verse

While Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside by themselves, and said to them on the way, 'See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified; and on the third day he will be raised.' Then the mother of the sons of Zebedee came to him with her sons, and kneeling before him, she asked a favour of him. And he said to her, 'What do you want?' She said to him, 'Declare that these two sons of mine will sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom.' But Jesus answered, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?' They said to him, 'We are able.' He said to them, 'You will indeed drink my cup, but to sit at my right hand and at my left, this is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father.' When the ten heard it, they were angry with the two brothers. But Jesus called them to him and said, 'You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.' As they were leaving Jericho, a large crowd followed him. There were two blind men sitting by the roadside. When they heard that Jesus was passing by, they shouted, 'Lord,^[a] have mercy on us, Son of David!' The crowd sternly ordered them to be quiet; but they shouted even more loudly, 'Have mercy on us, Lord, Son of David!' Jesus stood still and called them, saying, 'What do you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Lord, let our eyes be opened.' Moved with compassion, Jesus touched their eyes. Immediately they regained their sight and followed him.

Here ends the second lesson.

EASTER IS COMING...

...but we cannot arrive at the empty tomb without first making the journey through the Cross. Holy Week is not a prelude to Easter; it is the heart of our faith. The betrayal, the trial, the darkness of Good Friday, the silence of Holy Saturday - these are not things to be skipped over in our eagerness to reach the Alleluias. They are the very ground from which resurrection springs.

This year, we are delighted to offer two beautiful ancient services new to the Cathedral's Holy Week programme: Tenebrae, with its gradual extinguishing of lights and haunting choral music, and the Easter Vigil, that most dramatic of all liturgies, in which we wait together in darkness for the first light of resurrection. Both services carry centuries of devotion within them, and both will be accompanied by the Cathedral's outstanding musicians.

Please make every effort to journey with us through Holy Week. Come to as many services as you can. Let the liturgy do its work on you. You will not reach Easter in the same way if you have not first stood at the foot of the Cross. A leaflet listing all our Holy Week and Easter services is available at the back of the Cathedral - please do take one. Dean Bob

BISHOP ANDREW WATSON FUNERAL

The funeral of our beloved Bishop Andrew will take place in Guildford Cathedral on Monday 23 March at 12 noon. Bishop Paul wrote to the diocese on Wednesday with details of how we can make this service available to as many people as possible whilst recognising that the Cathedral will not be large enough to accommodate all who will wish to come. For that reason, with the help of Area Deans, a church has been identified in each deanery which will live stream the service to enable people to worship with the congregation in the Cathedral.

(cofeguildford.org.uk) We encourage members of the Cathedral congregations to make use of this facility because seats in the Cathedral will be prioritised for the family and friends of Bishop Andrew; bishops with whom he served in the Church of England and further afield; clergy of the diocese with whom he shared the cure of souls; representatives of different ministries within the diocese and nation; and representatives of the wider life of our part of

Surrey, Hampshire, Sussex and Greater London. Thank you for your understanding and please continue to pray for Beverly, Hannah, Sam, Joe, Lydia and the whole family.

OBSERVING THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS DURING LENT

Our final observance of the Stations of the Cross in the Cathedral nave takes place on Friday 27 March at 1pm. During this service we reflect on images of Christ's Passion, sing a hymn, hear a Bible reading and pray.
