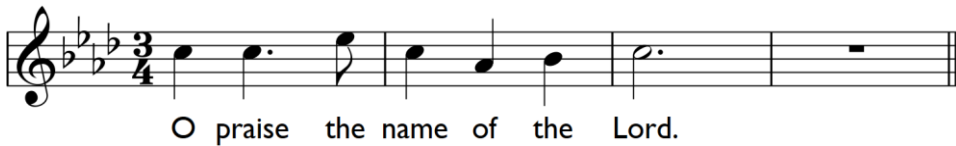
COLLECT
