NEW TESTAMENT READING Acts 1.15-17, 21-end read by James Luckey

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus - for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.'

So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us - one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."

Cathedral Sound System

A further meeting of the sound system working group was held this week. Whilst the general improvement continues there was a problem with the tuning of the Dean's clip-on microphone on Sunday, which meant that she was less audible when speaking from the pulpit than when speaking from the steps to the Chancel. The problem with the microphone has now been rectified. The system's Digital Analogue Converter, which has a defect requiring it to be re-set every six weeks, will be fixed when parts arrive from the manufacturer in the next fourteen days. Meanwhile it has been re-set so that there will be no recurrence of the problems experienced on 15 April. The extra loudspeaker for the choir stalls is on order, as are the extra clip-on microphones that will enable all clergy to have their own microphone tuned to their individual voices. The amplification in the Quire which was disabled to enable the Virgers to manage the system from the sound desk, has been restored and the Virgers will soon be able to control the sound from the Nave. Some of their functions in the Quire will be performed by the Servers, or thanks to them for their flexibility. Thanks also to Ken Cornwell, Sue Howland, Janet Matthews and Donald Thompson for their invaluable feedback on the system's performance. A plan of the Nave is available at the Guide's Desk if anyone else wishes to record where they were sitting when experiencing difficulty in hearing at any service.
