Bell ringing contest

Each year our bell ringers enter a team for the National 12-Bell Striking Contest. Having qualified in an eliminator contest at Southwell Minster in March they then took part in the final at the University Church of Great St Mary in Cambridge last Saturday, 23 June. They were up against nine other teams, from Birmingham, Bristol, Cambridge, Exeter, Leeds, Melbourne (Derbyshire), St Paul's Cathedral and two other London-based teams. The standard of ringing was very high throughout and our team scored a very good 72%. Although this was the lowest score, only 11 percentage points separated teams 3 to 10. The contest was won by Birmingham, with the Cambridge team coming a close second on their own bells. In addition to the participants, a great many other ringers attended to listen to the ringing and enjoy one of the great ringing occasions of the year in perfect weather. In 2021 we will host the finals of the Contest and we look forward to welcoming teams from all over the country.
