### **Eco-Tip Number Four**

Reducing your meat consumption can help your Carbon Footprint

A meat eater's carbon footprint is around twice that of a vegan. If you like meat consider swapping beef and lamb for chicken and fish. Cows and sheep emit methane and so beef and lamb have a higher CO2 footprint than chicken and fish. There are also a variety of meat substitutes on the market such as tofu and Quorn. Adding beans and more vegetables to stews will make meat stretch further and if you make in bulk you can freeze spare portions for those days you want a ready-made meal. Have one or two meat free days per week. As always buying local produce from a known source is a great way to reduce the transport mileage of produce.
