He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' Eco Tip Number 5

The 4 R's

Almost everything we buy has a carbon footprint. By buying less we can reduce the rate at which natural resources are used up and the earth is polluted.

Refuse - wait at least 24 hours before buying something you have seen in an advert be it a gadget or a holiday.

Reduce - buy less, travel less, buy recycled goods

Reuse/Repair - avoid single use items, use charity shops and give away organisations such as Freecycle and Gumtree. Have a go at repairing broken items rather than replace them.

Recycle - this is the last resort. It does reduce the rate we use natural resources but a lot of energy is used in the recycling process.
