### OLD TESTAMENT Exodus 32.7-14 read by Linda Sharpin

The Lord said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ' The Lord said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.' But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? ## **Shape of Sundays from 6 October**

As from 6 October the 11.30am service on the first Sunday of the month will be a traditional rite Choral Eucharist. This will reduce the number of Sundays during the year when the Order One traditional rite is replaced with Order Two contemporary rite. The 9.45am Cathedral Eucharist will be a shorter service and one which has more congregational participation so will be more accessible for those who have never been to church or who have fallen out of the habit and would like to be able to introduce their children or grandchildren to worship. This development will enhance what we offer on Sundays. We will continue to offer Choral Mattins on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of the month. As a cathedral community we recognised last year that together 'we need to grow the congregation'. Chapter has invested in a whole new area of Family Engagement, which is already bearing much fruit and also continued to invest in outreach. We will review these changes in a year. Thank you to everyone for their comments and questions. It will be helpful for us all to be aware of how our engagement with God through worship is strengthened and nourished and to continue to reflect upon this question together.
