
When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, 'Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us.' When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of

power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me.’ You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.


## HYMN 254

### GOSPEL READING John 6.25-35

The Holy Gospel is written in the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to Saint John, beginning at the twenty-fifth verse.



When they found Jesus on the other side of the lake, they said to him, ‘Rabbi, when did you come here?’ Jesus answered them, ‘Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.’ Then they said to him, ‘What must we do to perform the works of God?’ Jesus answered them, ‘This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.’ So they said to him, ‘What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, “He gave them bread from heaven to eat.”’ Then Jesus said to them, ‘Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which\* comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.’ They said to him, ‘Sir, give us this bread always.’ Jesus said to them, ‘I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

## **Parking at the Cathedral**

All visitors to the Cathedral, the Shop and Seasons Café can park on site for up to 2 hours without taking any further action. If your visit is going to be longer than 2 hours please ask a member of staff in the Shop or Seasons Café to assist you with entering your details into the key pad to extend your parking for another 2 hours, before your initial 2 hours has expired. On a Sunday there is an exemption in

place between 8am and 1pm and between 5pm and 7 pm to allow people to attend services with no parking worries. Exemptions are also put in place for other special services. Please can all volunteers register your vehicle with the Volunteer Co-Ordinator or with your Volunteer Section Head. This registration will allow you to park for up to 5 hours without taking any additional action. If you are going to be here for longer than that simply call into the Office and see either Lisa or Emma who will be able to extend your parking. It is your responsibility to keep your vehicle details up to date – if you change your details and don't tell the Office you may receive a parking fine in the post. ### **The Rosary: The Glorious Mysteries – Sunday 20 October, 11.30am**

The Rosary is intended to encourage meditation on key incidents from the Gospels and allow reflection on the implications of the Incarnation. The themes of the Rosary are divided into Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and Luminous mysteries. Whilst the repeated prayers invoke the Blessed Virgin Mary, the intention is to meditate on Christ, her son, and his love for us. The Rosary is an established meditation amongst catholic Anglicans but can be helpful to all, whatever their tradition within the Church of England. The Glorious Mysteries include the Resurrection and Ascension of Our Lord, the sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost & the Assumption. The Rosary will be led by Donald Thompson in the
