The Treasury: Featured parish St. Martin of Tours, Epsom.

The parish church of Epsom is almost entirely a building of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, apart from the fifteenth-century Perpendicular north-west tower. Amongst its treasures on display are a rare pair of silver flagons with the London hallmarks of 1702 and 1703.
