Eco-Tip 9

Some ways to enjoy Christmas with a lighter CO2 footprint

Although we haven't yet begun the season of Advent many have already begun preparations for the Christmas celebrations. Our annual festival of hyper-consumerism requires the extraction of vast quantities of raw materials to be processed into (often unwanted) presents for friends and relations which may well end up going back into the ground as landfill. With this in mind here are a few ideas on how we can enjoy Christmas but with a lighter and more sustainable footprint.

Give purposefully and not for the sake of it. Look for gifts that come with as little packaging as possible. Steer away from gifts that need batteries. Buy cards and wrapping paper that are glitter free and recyclable. Consider reducing the number of Christmas cards you send or why not send virtual cards. Why not think about doing a Secret Santa with some of your family and friends or contribute towards one big present for each family member.

Opt for Eco friendly and Fairtrade gifts – many available on our Traidcraft stall. Support local businesses by giving gifts of artisan food, English wine, local arts and crafts.

Why not buy a gift of an experience such as a cinema trip, an afternoon tea voucher, or a membership to an organisation such as RSPB, Surrey Wildlife Trust, or World Wildlife Fund. Virtual gifts are available from many charities and perfect for the one who has everything – benefitting developing communities and strengthening knowledge about the lives of others.

Plan your seasonal meals to minimise waste. Consider reducing the amount of meat you eat over the Christmas period. Think about where your 'food-miles' and method of transport. Where possible buy LOAF (local, organic, animal friendly and Fairtrade).
